

VIRTUAL LEARNING, WORKSHOPS AND OUTREACH VISITS

Online learning, virtual workshop and Outreach visits are a great way for schools to access flexible, personalised learning experiences, especially if they are unable physically visit. Here is a list of some of the country's finest museums and attractions offering ways of learning that can mean reduced costs for schools and repeated access to course materials.

Aerospace Bristol – explore a range of fun and educational activities & resources to enjoy at home or in the classroom. Make your own air show and Exercise like an Astronaut are two of our

Black Country Living Museum - many of their onsite activities and shows can be brought to your classroom for the Birmingham and Black Country area. Packages are available on a half day or full day basis with a variety of workshops and shows on offer suitable for various Key Stages and early years foundation stage (EYFS).

Jewish Museum London – although the museum closed to all visitors in the Summer in order to progress plans for a new Future Museum in a more prominent location, they are still active offering Virtual Classroom workshops. These are based on a guided exploration experience of their unique collection of authentic objects enabling students to ask questions about what is means to be Jewish in Britain today. All Virtual Workshops are 45 minutes to 1 hour. https://jewishmuseum.org.uk/learning/virtual-classrooms/

Kielder Observatory - Bring the night skies of Kielder Observatory to your school! Kielder can deliver sessions suitable for all ages, ranging from KS1 up to A Level. They offer a variety of workshops linked into the curriculum and your students can even touch a piece of the Moon! Using video conferencing software, astronomers can deliver sessions into the classroom and directly interact with students. These types of sessions would be delivered as a 1 on 1 session (1 astronomer and 1 class) for greater impact and to get as close to an in-person school visit as possible. They can cover any space related topics that are requested to any year groups. Alternatively, astronomers can deliver livestreams on a wide range of topics for an unlimited number of students to watch live in the classroom. As part of the livestream, there would be a Q&A section so teachers can submit questions on behalf of students to be answered live during the stream. This option would be most suitable if you would like them to deliver sessions for multiple classes at once.

Liverpool Museums – have a vast range of Worksheets and downloadable resources including LGBTQ+ history, Ancient Egypt, The Titanic, First World War, Second World War, Greek Myths and Fundamental British Values.

Monkey World - Ape Rescue Centre - if you can't visit, the Education team from Monkey World can visit your classroom within a 100-mile radius with a member of the Team delivering talks and workshops as an Outreach session. Museum of Oxford (MOX) - The only museum to focus on telling the stories of people past and present from Oxford, the Museum has a MOX Podcast that is well worth a listen to. https://museumofoxford.org/collection
