WORLD EMOJI DAY

17 JULY

Emoji is a word that originally meant “pictograph” or “icon” and World Emoji Day is a fun way to start a serious conversation with your students about communication. Emojis are the new shorthand, crossing language barriers and have become a useful tool to be able to send abbreviated messages making communications fun and alive.

The history of emojis in their current form can be traced back to the 1990s when Japanese mobile phone operator DoCoMo put a heart inscription on a cheap pager which was an instance success with teenagers. When they introduced an updated pager, they omitted the heart inscription which led to a huge outcry from their customers, many left and joined another pager company who had adopted the heart inscription. In 1999, DoCoMo realised that they were onto something and employed a team to develop 176 pixilated characters to describe the weather, feelings and general day to day images and objects.

By 2007 the Unicode Consortium, a Silicon Valley non-profit organisation, began to standardize emojis so that they would appear the same on all platforms, regardless of what type of phone, computer or website was being used. By 2011, Apple introduced them onto their iPhones and today, 30 years on from their early beginnings, a staggering 5 billion emojis are sent every day on Facebook alone.

Whether you love or hate emojis in professional communications, there’s no doubt they’re becoming more common in the workplace too and as George Orwell once said, “Never use a long word where a short one will do.”

Captain Cook Memorial Museum, Whitby

The story begins at the handsome 17th century harbourside house now the Captain Cook Memorial Museum. This is where the great explorer, James Cook, came to serve his apprenticeship in Whitby in the year 1746. It belonged to Cook’s master, the Quaker ship owner, Captain John Walker. When the young Cook was not at sea, he lodged here in the attic with Walker’s ‘other family’ of apprentices. Cook’s voyages were the 18th century equivalent of today’s missions to Mars. For ten years Cook and his crews explored the unknown, uncharted waters of the Pacific, the South Atlantic, and the Arctic Oceans. Danger was ever present. The thought-provoking collection of original paintings and drawings, letters in Cook’s own hand, ship models, maps and fascinating objects gathered on the voyages illustrate the Cook story. New special exhibition every year. 2022 - ‘Sea Peoples – Navigating the Pacific’. Describes the ways Polynesians and Europeans overcame the greatest of the world’s oceans Open until 31 October 0945 – 1700 Last admission half an hour before closing. Curious Creatures: Victorian attitudes to animals

Get ready to meet a gallery of pet lovers, lion tamers, pigeon fanciers, colonial hunters, offal eaters, feather-hat wearers and more at Abbey House Museum. Curious Creatures explores the many ways in which the Victorians interacted with and sometimes exploited animals. Focussing on the period 1810-1914, the exhibition looks at ethical issues about our relationship with nature that are still relevant today.

Objects on display will include taxidermy animals and items made from animal skin or bone. Due to the nature of the exhibition content, visitors may find that they are unsettled whilst uncovering the stories of animal treatment in the Victorian era.

Community display: Kirkstall Lives

This exhibition celebrates the lives of people who have lived, worked and visited the Leeds suburb of Kirkstall. Famous for its dramatic 12th century abbey, the area has long been a thriving community, with generations of families calling Kirkstall home.

From historic institutions including Kirkstall brewery and the Abbey Picture House, to St Stephen's school and the Kirkstall Festival, this exhibition will explore the memories of people who have made Kirkstall a part of their history.
